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# INFORMACIÓN BÁSICA SOBRE EL VIH

## ¿Qué es el VIH?

El VIH es el Virus de Inmunodeficiencia Humana. Éste ataca la capacidad de su cuerpo para combatir enfermedades y debilita su sistema inmunológico.

El VIH se contagia por contacto con cuatro tipos de fluidos del organismo: sangre, semen, fluidos vaginales y leche materna. Existen tres formas de transmisión del VIH: contacto sangre-sangre (como puede ser al compartir una aguja con alguien que es VIH-positivo); tener relaciones sexuales sin protección (oral, anal o vaginal) con una persona que es VIH-positivo; y de madre a hijo (antes o durante el parto o a través de la leche materna). El VIH no se transmite a través de contacto casual como puede ser un abrazo, saludar de mano, sentarse junto a alguien, compartir alimentos, usar teléfonos o ser picado por un insecto.

La enfermedad provocada por el VIH puede progresar hasta el SIDA (Síndrome de Inmunodeficiencia Adquirida) situación en que el sistema inmunológico está gravemente dañado. Sin embargo, con un diagnóstico temprano de VIH y participación en el tratamiento médico, es posible prevenir el SIDA.

## ¿Cómo funciona el VIH? – Las cuatro etapas:

Etapa 1: En la primera etapa, la infección por VIH es reciente y comúnmente ocurre de 2 -8 semanas después que el virus ha sido introducido al organismo. Durante este periodo, la persona puede tener los síntomas de una gripe. El sistema inmunológico aún es capaz de contraatacar y los síntomas pueden durar solamente unos cuantos días o hasta 2 semanas.

Etapa 2: En esta etapa, la persona puede verse y sentirse perfectamente saludable. Los síntomas pueden no presentarse por otros 8 a 10 años en algunos casos. Sin embargo, el virus continúa trabajando y dañando el sistema inmunológico.

Etapa 3: En la etapa 3, la persona empieza a experimentar síntomas que pueden incluir fiebre, sudor nocturno, inflamación de las glándulas linfáticas del cuello, axilas o ingle, infecciones del aparato respiratorio superior, fatiga, diarrea, pérdida acelerada de peso, falta de apetito, infecciones vaginales u orales ocasionadas por hongos, manchas blancas en la boca o ronchas. El VIH también puede dañar el sistema nervioso, con lo cual la persona olvida con facilidad las cosas y/o se confunde. Estos síntomas son persistentes y pueden durar desde varias semanas a varios años. Si usted experimenta cualquiera de estos síntomas durante más de una semana, deberá ver a un proveedor de atención de la salud. Si bien éstos pueden ser signos de otras enfermedades, es importante consultar al médico.

Etapa 4: En la etapa final, el VIH ha dañado gravemente al sistema inmunológico, haciendo que el cuerpo sea vulnerable a la infección y a la enfermedad. El SIDA está ahora completamente desarrollado. En algunos casos, esto no ocurre hasta más de 10 años después de la infección, o en absoluto, especialmente con la ayuda de tratamiento. También es importante que la condición de SIDA sea diagnosticada y confirmada por un médico. Con el cuerpo debilitado por SIDA, pueden presentarse simultáneamente otras infecciones tales como tuberculosis (TB), cáncer cervical invasor, JVC (la neumonía relacionada con el SIDA anteriormente conocida como PCP), el síndrome de desgaste, candida/candidosis, retinitis por CMV, sarcoma de Kaposi y toxoplasmosis.

**Cómo es el tratamiento:** Un diagnóstico temprano de VIH y un tratamiento continuo, incluso con terapia antiretroviral (TAR), pueden ayudar para vivir una vida plena y activa. Actualmente no hay una cura para la infección por VIH o SIDA. Pero los tratamientos nuevos sirven para combatir al virus y prolongar la vida de los infectados. Hable con su proveedor de atención de la salud para aprender más y decidir qué es lo mejor para usted.

## **Prevención del VIH**

**Conozca los riesgos/prevenga la enfermedad:** El VIH afecta a personas de todas las clases sociales, cualquiera puede infectarse. Claro que, algunos comportamientos son más riesgosos que otros. Por eso es importante conocer los riesgos como así maneras de prevenir el VIH. Las maneras más seguras de prevenir el VIH son la abstinencia (no tener relaciones sexuales); no inyectarse drogas o compartir agujas; y en el caso de las mujeres embarazadas, consultar sobre el tratamiento durante el embarazo. Las prácticas sexuales seguras mediante el uso de profilácticos de látex o poliuretano ayudarán a reducir la difusión de VIH. Use un profiláctico nuevo cada vez y un lubricante acuoso para las relaciones vaginales y anales.

Recuerde que...

- Utilizar productos oleosos tales como la jalea de petróleo o lociones para el cuerpo con profilácticos de látex puede provocar la rotura del profiláctico.
- Los profilácticos nunca deben volver a usarse.
- Si usted se inyecta drogas, no comparta su equipo y solamente use agujas y jeringas nuevas y que han sido esterilizadas.

### **Condones Pedidos por Correo**

### **El Test**

El test de VIH se encuentra ampliamente disponible. La mayoría de los centros que realizan tests son capaces de realizar el test rápido de VIH, con resultados preliminares a los 20 minutos. Estos centros proveen orientación para sus problemas, responden preguntas y lo ayudan con referencias a proveedores de atención de la salud para VIH. ### **La PrEP (profilaxis preposición)**

La PrEP (profilaxis preposición) son medicamentos que toman las personas que están en riesgo de infección por el VIH para prevenir contraerlo a través de las relaciones sexuales o el consumo de drogas inyectables. Cuando se toman según las indicaciones, los medicamentos de la PrEP son altamente eficaces para prevenir la infección por el VIH. # Sobre el tratamiento/Información médica

## Visitas Médicas y Tests de Laboratorio

**Introducción:** Una parte significativa de su atención de la salud por VIH comprende visitas periódicas a su proveedor de atención de la salud proveedor de atención médica para el VIH (HCP), para exámenes y tests de laboratorio (lab). Los tests de laboratorio se usan como parte de su plan de tratamiento para vigilar la progresión de su VIH y para brindar información que será de utilidad para que usted y su HCP tomen decisiones sobre su régimen de tratamiento—si usted debería comenzar, detener o cambiar sus medicamentos de tratamiento. Un firme compromiso con sus turnos médicos y tests periódicos de laboratorio es una forma importante de hacerse cargo de su salud.

Más abajo, se resume la información sobre cómo interpretar los resultados de los tests de laboratorio. InfoNet provee información sobre el tratamiento en forma de hojas de datos de un solo tema que se actualizan frecuentemente. Luego haga ‘clic’ en la categoría “tests de laboratorio” (“Laboratory Tests”) para obtener un listado completo de todas las hojas de datos de las pruebas de laboratorio.] Las hojas de datos que se ven están presentadas en cinco idiomas: inglés, español, ruso, indonesio (bahasa indonesia) y nepalés. A través de acuerdos en colaboración con organizaciones de servicios para el SIDA en varios países, InfoNet está expandiendo el rango de idiomas en el cual ofrece sus materiales. Siempre hable con su HCP sobre sus resultados de laboratorio.

**Datos básicos:** Hay varios tipos diferentes de tests de laboratorio que pueden usarse para vigilar el VIH y el estado general de su salud. Según su estado de salud y si recibe o no medicamentos, su HCP determinará con cuánta frecuencia deben realizarse estos tests. Es importante, cuando a usted primero se lo diagnostica o cuando comienza con su primer régimen de tratamiento, que se haga los tests de laboratorio para tener datos iniciales para futuras comparaciones.

**Test de carga viral:** El test de carga viral mide la cantidad de virus VIH en su sangre. El mejor resultado del test de carga viral es “no detectable”. Esto no significa que no hay virus en su sangre. Solamente significa que no hay suficiente para que el test lo encuentre y lo cuente. De hecho, la investigación ahora muestra que las personas con VIH que logran y mantienen una carga viral indetectable tomando ART diariamente según lo prescrito no pueden transmitir el virus sexualmente a otros, un concepto conocido como Indetectable = Intransmisible. Para obtener información detallada sobre el test de carga viral, hable con su HCP y vea la hoja de datos de InfoNet número 125.

**Prueba de células CD4:** El test de medición de células CD4 mide cuántas células CD4 (también conocidas como células T) hay en su cuerpo. Las células CD4 son parte de su sistema inmunitario, el cual es responsable de combatir las infecciones. Las células CD4 son el blanco directo del VIH. El recuento de células CD4 es la clave para medir la salud del sistema inmunitario. Cuanto más bajo el recuento, mayor es el daño que ha hecho el VIH. Todo el que tenga menos de 200 células CD4, o un porcentaje de CD4 menor al 14% se considera que tiene SIDA, según los Centros para el Control de Enfermedades de los EE.UU.. Los recuentos de CD4 también se usan para indicar cuándo se deben iniciar ciertos tipos de terapia con medicamentos. **Test de resistencia al VIH:** El VIH es “resistente” a un medicamento si sigue multiplicándose rápidamente mientras usted toma su medicamento. Cambios (mutaciones) en el virus provocan resistencia. El VIH generalmente se vuelve resistente cuando no es totalmente controlado por el/los medicamento/s que alguien está tomando. Sin embargo, más personas se están infectando con VIH que ya es resistente a uno o más medicamento/s antirretroviral/es (ARV). Una de las razones principales del desarrollo de resistencia es no tomar los ARVs tal como se recetan. Hay varios tipos de tests de resistencia. Su HCP determinará qué tipo de test es necesario, si es que es necesario alguno. Para información detallada sobre el test de resistencia del VIH, hable con su HCP y vea la hoja de informe de datos de InfoNet número 126 (Fact Sheet Number 126).

**Otros tests de laboratorio:** Se usan otros tests de laboratorio para vigilar su estado de salud, incluso: Recuento completo de células sanguíneas (hoja de informe de datos 121), Panel de química (hoja de informe de datos 122), Lípidos—Azúcar y grasas en sangre (hoja de datos 123). Hable con su HCP también acerca de estos tests.

### ¿Qué Debe Traer Cuando Viene para una Visita?

Abajo se detalla la lista de los documentos que debe traer cuando acude a una visita de admisión o a una visita de investigación financiera. Esta lista puede no incluir todo lo que necesitará pero es una buena lista inicial.

- Photo I.D. (Driver's License, Delaware Identification Card)
- Identificación con una foto (licencia de conducir, tarjeta de identificación de Delaware)
- Tarjeta de seguro de salud de Medicaid/Medicare
- Tarjeta de seguridad social
- Verificación de ingresos (recibos de sueldo, carta de adjudicación de SSI, solicitud de SSI/SSDI, carta de adjudicación de asistencia general, carta de adjudicación de estampillas para alimentos, etc.)
- Seguros de vida en los cuales usted es el asegurado
- Evidencia de domicilio (facturas de servicios, facturas de teléfono, etc.)
- Acuerdo de alquiler, factura de hipoteca
- Nombre, dirección y teléfono de todos los médicos
- Lista de medicamentos

## Glosario de Términos y Acrónimos

**ADAP (Programa de asistencia con medicamentos para SIDA)** – Un programa que ayuda a las personas a pagar los medicamentos relacionados con el VIH.

**C & T (Orientación y tests)** – El proceso voluntario, interactivo, cuyo centro es el cliente, en el que se comparte información y un individuo toma conciencia de la información básica sobre VIH/SIDA, los procedimientos de tests, cómo prevenir la transmisión y adquisición de la infección por VIH, y se le brinda apoyo según sus necesidades sobre cómo adaptar esta información a su vida.

**CDC (Centros Para El Control y La Prevención De Enfermedades)** – La agencia federal dentro del Departamento de Salud y Servicios Humanos de EE.UU. que administra los programas de prevención de VIH/SIDA; responsable del monitoreo y elaboración de informes sobre las enfermedades infecciosas.

**Células CD4 (también conocidas como células T)** – Las células CD4 (también conocidas como células T) son los leucocitos ‘ayudantes’, parte de su sistema inmunológico. Cuando el VIH infecta a los humanos, las células que infecta son con mayor frecuencia células CD4. El virus pasa a formar parte de las células, y cuando se multiplican para combatir una infección, también hacen más copias de VIH.

**CM (Administrador de casos)** – Un administrador de casos provee un rango de servicios centrados en el cliente que relaciona a los clientes con la atención médica primaria, los servicios psico-sociales y otros para asegurar un acceso coordinado y a tiempo a los niveles de salud y servicios de apoyo apropiados, la continuidad de la atención, la evaluación continua de las necesidades del cliente y de otros miembros de la familia y sistemas de apoyo personal.

**Consorcio** – Un grupo de planificación establecido en cada estado para planificar y a veces para administrar los fondos Ryan White de la Parte B. Los miembros del consorcio generalmente son proveedores de servicios de atención de la salud, proveedores de servicios de apoyo y consumidores.

**CTRPN (Orientación, tests, referencias y notificación de la pareja)** – CTRPN son los servicios voluntarios para VIH de orientación y tests, referencia a los servicios médicos y sociales apropiados, y la notificación anónima o confidencial, por parte de personal del departamento de salud, de la pareja con la que se comparte sexo o agujas cuando incluye tests; incluye la orientación previa al test.

**Demografía** – Las características estadísticas de las poblaciones humanas tales como edad, raza, etnia y sexo.

**Epidemia** – La difusión de una enfermedad infecciosa en una población o área geográfica.

**EFA (Asistencia financiera de emergencia)** – Ayuda ocasional y de emergencia para pagar el alquiler o los servicios.

**Factor de riesgo o comportamiento de riesgo** – Comportamiento u otros factores que hacen que una persona tenga riesgo de enfermedad.

**HCP (Proveedor de atención de la salud)** – Especialistas de la medicina que incluyen médicos, enfermeras y asistentes de médicos.

**HOPWA (Oportunidades de vivienda para personas con SIDA)** – Un programa administrado por el Departamento de Viviendas y Desarrollo Urbano de los EE.UU. que provee fondos para apoyar a las personas que viven con VIH y sus familias.

**HRSA (Recursos de Salud y Servicios de Administración)** – La agencia federal en el Departamento de Salud y Servicios Humanos de los EE.UU. que administra del Programa Ryan White contra VIH/SIDA (RWHAP, por sus siglas en inglés)

**IDU (Usuario de drogas inyectables)** – Personas en riesgo para la infección VIH a través del equipo usado para inyectar drogas (por ejemplo, jeringas, agujas, cocinas, cucharas, etc.).

**MSM (Hombres que tienen relaciones sexuales con hombres)** – Los hombres que informan tener contacto sexual con otros hombres u hombres que informan tener contacto sexual tanto con hombres como con mujeres.

**MSM/IDU** – Hombres que informan tener contacto sexual con otros hombres y que son usuarios de drogas inyectables.

**OIs (Infecciones oportunistas)** – Infecciones que se aprovechan de un sistema inmunitario debilitado. Algunas de las más comunes son tuberculosis (TB), cáncer cervical invasor, JVC (anteriormente conocida como neumonía pneumocystis o PCP), el síndrome de desgaste, candida/candidosis, retinitis por CMV, sarcoma de Kaposi y toxoplasmosis.

**Planificación Completa** – El proceso de determinar la organización y entrega de los servicios para VIH; las estrategias utilizadas por el consejo de planificación o el consorcio para poder tomar mejores decisiones sobre los servicios y para desarrollar y mantener un proceso continuo de atención para las personas que viven con VIH.

**PLWH (Persona que vive con VIH)** – Una persona que vive con la enfermedad de VIH o SIDA.

**Servicios de prevención** – Intervenciones, estrategias, programas, y estructuras diseñados para cambiar el comportamiento y para prevenir la infección por VIH u otra enfermedad.

**Ley Ryan White de Modernización del Tratamiento del VIH/SIDA de 2009:** la legislación federal principal diseñada para abordar las necesidades de atención médica y servicios de apoyo de las personas que viven con la enfermedad del VIH y sus familias en los Estados Unidos se promulgó por primera vez en 1990 como la Ley Ryan White Integral sobre el SIDA. Ley de Emergencia (CARE). Ha sido enmendado y reautorizado cuatro veces en 1996, 2000, 2006 y 2009.

**SIDA (Síndrome de inmunodeficiencia adquirida)** - La enfermedad por VIH se transforma en SIDA cuando su sistema inmunológico está gravemente dañado. En general, si usted tiene menos de 200 células CD4 o se le diagnostica una infección oportunista, se le define como con SIDA.

**VIH (Virus de la inmunodeficiencia humana)** – El VIH ataca y debilita una parte de su sistema inmunológico (las células CD4) Esto afecta la capacidad de su cuerpo para combatir enfermedades. Cuando no es tratado el VIH puede eventualmente progresar hasta el SIDA.
